Bronchitis is <u>inflammation</u> of the <u>mucous membranes</u> of the <u>bronchi</u>, the airways that carry airflow from the <u>trachea</u> into the <u>lungs</u>. Bronchitis can be divided into two categories, acute and chronic, each of which has two distinct etiologies, pathologies, and therapies.

<u>Acute bronchitis</u> is characterized by the development of a <u>cough</u>, with or without the production of <u>sputum</u>, <u>mucus</u> that is <u>expectorated</u> (coughed up) from the <u>respiratory tract</u>. Acute bronchitis often occurs during the course of an acute viral illness such as the <u>common cold</u> or <u>influenza</u>. <u>Viruses</u> cause about 90% of cases of acute bronchitis, whereas bacteria account for fewer than 10%.[1]

<u>Chronic bronchitis</u>, a type of <u>chronic obstructive pulmonary disease</u>, is characterized by the presence of a productive cough that lasts for three months or more per year for at least two years. Chronic bronchitis most often develops due to recurrent injury to the airways caused by inhaled irritants. <u>Cigarette smoking</u> is the most common cause, followed by <u>air pollution</u> and occupational exposure to irritants.[1]
